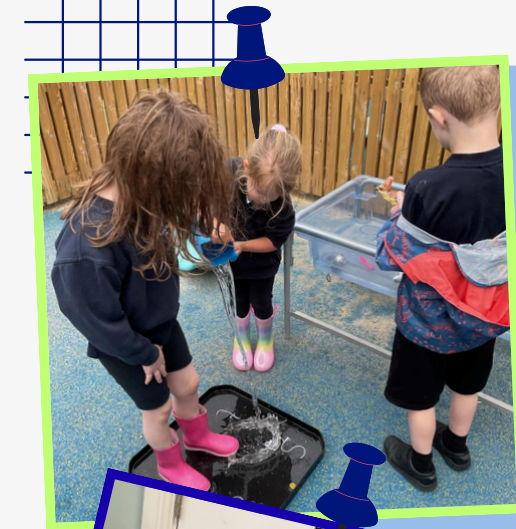

Cornflowers

This week in Cornflowers Class, we had lots of fun playing Twister. The children practised important social skills such as taking turns, sharing, listening to instructions, and encouraging their friends. They showed great patience and kindness throughout the game.

We have also continued exploring our water topic. The children designed and made boats from different materials, then tested whether they would float and how much weight they could hold before sinking. They made predictions, observed the results, and explored floating, sinking, and buoyancy.

Daisies

This week in Daisies, we have embraced our new water topic. The children enjoyed feeling water on their hands and faces using a water spritz, which brought lots of giggles and smiles!

We also explored walking on wet surfaces and discussed how to stay safe by moving carefully and being aware of slippery areas, linking our learning to Child Safety Week. The children painted different types of weather and talked about what they could see in the sky, creating a fun sensory experience. Great learning through play this week—well done Daisies!



Buttercups

This week in Buttercups, the children enjoyed exploring water, pouring it over water wheels, splashing in puddles and even creating their own giant puddle! There was lots of laughter as some children jumped in with their wellies while others helped fill it using jugs.

For Child Safety Week, we focused on road safety. The children practised stopping, waiting and listening during a fun outdoor game, running or scooting when they heard "Go" and stopping safely when they heard "Stop". What a fun week in Buttercups!

This week in Bluebells, we have enjoyed spending lots of time in our outdoor area, making fish soup in the mud kitchen, exploring water play and racing cars around the track.

To celebrate Child Safety Week, we practised handwashing and talked about the importance of hygiene. We also enjoyed sensory water play, exploring our senses through a range of exciting activities.

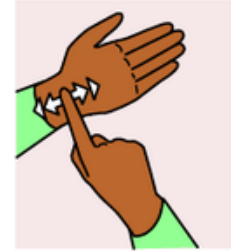
